This Week's Vaccine Allocation

New Jersey is able to allocate a total of 254,650 doses of the vaccine. Here's the breakdown:

- 55,575 Pfizer vaccines will be administered as first doses
- 55,575 Pfizer vaccines will also be administered as second doses
- 87,400 Moderna vaccines will be administered as first doses
 - This is over 6,000 doses more than we expected to receive
- 56.100 Moderna vaccines will also be administered as second doses

As vaccine doses continue to increase, we'll be able to open more appointments and give eligible residents more opportunities to get vaccinated. Click here to visit the State's Data Dashboard for more data about the State's COVID-19 response and vaccination efforts.
